
MY GAN SHELANU HAGGADAH



Hadlakat Nerot – Lighting the Candles - הדלקת נרות

בְרוּדְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֶלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלְם, אֲשֶׁר קּדְּשְׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתִיו, וְצְוְנוּ לְהַדְלִיק גֵר שֶׁל (שָׁבָּת ו)יוֹם טוֹב.

(Say words in the parentheses when a seder falls on a Friday evening)

Barukh Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh ha'Olam asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner shel (Shabbat v') yom Tov.

Praised are You *Adonai* our God who rules the universe, who makes us holy with *mitzvot* and commands us to kindle the light of (Shabbat and) *Pesach* this Festival.

בְרוּך אַתָּה וְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁהֶחֶינוּ וְקִיפְנוּ וְהִגִּיעָנוּ לַוְפֵן הַזֶּה.

Barukh Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh ha-Olam shehe<u>h</u>eyanu v'kiy'manu v'higyanu lazman hazeh.

Praised are you *Adonai* our God, who rules the universe, who has given us life, who has sustained us, and who has enabled us to reach this season.

1. Kadesh - Kiddush - ツブア

We sing Kiddush, the blessing over the wine. In the Pesach story, we are told four times that God promised freedom to our people.

(During the Seder we drink 4 glasses of wine. This is the first glass.)

2. Urchatz - Washing Hands - מרלים ליל ביי וויים או ביי לילים ביים לילים לילים לילים ביים לילים ביים לילים לילים לילים לילים ביים לילים לילים לילים ביים לילים לי

We wash our hands, but do not make a blessing. As we feel the water run through our fingers, it wakes up our minds and opens our senses.

3. Karpas - Dipping Greens - つりつう

We dip a vegetable other than the bitter herbs into salt water. The karpas is dipped to show freedom; slaves did not dip their vegetables. Salt water reminds us of our salty tears and sweat when we were slaves in Egypt.

4. Yachatz - Breaking the Middle Matzah - 🎢 🎵

We take the middle of the three matzot and break it into two. We put the larger part away for our dessert. This is called the afikomen.

We hide it carefully, so we can find it after the meal.

5. Maggid – Telling the Story - ブゾン

Telling the Passover story. The youngest person at the Seder asks the Four Questions. We answer by telling the story of Pesach. This is the night we express the very meaning of our existence as a Jewish people.

THE FOUR QUESTIONS אַרַבַע קוֹשִיוֹת

מַה נִשְתַנָה הַלַיִּלָה הַזֶּה מִכֹּל הַלֵּילוֹת?

Ma Nishtana ha-lila ha-zeh mi-kol haley-lot? Why is this night different from all other nights?

שַבְּבָל הַגִילוֹת אָנוּ אוֹבְלִין חָמֵץ וּמַצָה. הַלַיְלָה הַזֶּה בָּלְוֹ מַצָה.

Sh'b'chol ha-leylot anu ochlin chametz u-matzah. Ha-lila ha-zeh kulo matzah. On all other nights, we eat either <u>h</u>ametz or matzah, but on this night, only matzah.

שָבְּכָל הַלֵילוֹת אָנוּ אוֹכְלִין שְאָר יְרָקוֹת. הַלַיְלָה הַוֶּה מַרוֹר.


Sh'b'chol ha-leylot anu ochlin sh'ar y'rakot. Ha-lila hazeh maror. On all other nights, we eat other kinds of vegetables, but on this night, maror.

שָּבְכָל הַלֵּילוֹת אֵין אָנוּ מַטְבִּילִין אַפִּילוּ פַּעֵם אֶחָת. הַלַיְלָה הֵּזֶה שְׁתֵי פְּעָמִים. Sh'b'chol ha-leylot ein anu mat-bi-lin afilu pa'am echad. Ha-lila hazeh sh'tey p'amim. On all other nights, we do not dip even once, but on this night, we dip twice.

שֶּבְּכֶל הַלֵּילוֹת אָנוּ אוֹכְלִין בֵּין יוֹשְׁבִין וּבֵין מְסֻבִּין. הַלַיְלָה הַזֶּה בָּלְנוּ מְסֻבִּין. Sh'b'chol ha-leylot anu ochlin beyn yosh-veen u-veyn m'subin. Ha-lila ha-zeh kulan m'subin. On all other nights, we eat either sitting up or reclining, but on this night, we all recline.

6. Rachtzah – Washing Hands - הצור הוצלה

We wash our hands and make a blessing.

בְרוּךְ אַתָּח יִי אֱלֹחֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ חָעוֹלְם, אֲשֶׁר קִדִשְנוּ בִּמִצְוֹתִיו וִצְוָנוּ עַל נִטְלַת יְדַיִם.

Barukh Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh ha'Olam asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu al n'tilat yadayim

7. Motzi - Bracha Over the Bread - איניא

Raise remaining matzot and recite two blessings - - the motzi (thanking God for the food we eat) and the special matzah blessing.

בּרוּךְ אַתָּה יִי אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶיֶלְ הְעוֹיְם, הַמוֹצִיא יֶּיְהָ מִן הְאָרֶץ.

Barukh Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh ha'Olam hamotzi lehem min ha'aretz.

8. Matzah – Bracha Over the Matzah - אוציא מצה

Another blessing over the Matzah emphasizing eating matzah as a Passover ritual act.

בְרוּך אַתָּה וְיָ אֶלּהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אַשֶּׁר קִדְשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתִיו וְצִוָנוּ עֵל אֲכִלַת מֵצָה.

Barukh Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh ha'Olam asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu al akhilat matzah

9. Maror – Bracha Over the Bitter Herb - ארור

Dip the bitter herb in charoset. The bitter herb reminds us of the bitterness of slavery. The charoset looks like mortar and reminds us of the hard work that the slaves did. We say a blessing and we eat them.

10. Korech - Hillel Sandwich – לורך

It is time to eat a matzah sandwich!

Take 2 pieces of the bottom matzah and place a spoonful of maror (horseradish) and some charoset on it. Eat like a king or queen, reclining to the left.

Why the sandwich?
Rabbi Hillel, the head rabbi during Temple times, did this, so we do too!

11. Shulchan Oreych – The Festive Meal - שולחן עורך

12. *Tzafun* – Find and Eat the Afikomen - (like Hide and Seek)

The Afikomen helps us to remember what seems lost may be recovered. What seems broken may be repaired.

13. *Barech* – Recite the Birkat Hamazon The Blessing After the Meal - 773

Thank you Adonai. Thank you for the food we eat. Thank you for our parents who make life so sweet.

Cup for Elijah, The Prophet – אליהוי

Fill an extra cup of wine for Elijah, open the front door, and invite him in.

14. Hallel - 7777

Praise God who performed these miracles for us and for God's kindness to us.

15. Nirtzah – The Seder is Over - מרצה – The Seder is Over

Next year may we celebrate our Seder in Jerusalem in peace.
